Why?

- Surgery for lymphoedema is underfunded in the UK because there is a lack of robust research to support its use
- The Plastic Surgery Team at the Royal Marsden Hospital in association with the LSN are aiming to undertake a randomised control trial in surgery for lymphoedema to address this issue
- The first part of this process is to gather patient views on surgery and what outcomes they would feel would be most meaningful to them

Who?

When?

The live, virtual event for those with upper limb swelling will be on the 7^{th} July at 6 pm and will take approximately one hour to 90 minutes.

The live, virtual event for those with lower limb swelling will be on the 14^{th} of July at 6pm and will take approximately one hour to 90 minute.
